Biography

Bruno Liebhaberg. Vice president of FEPS and chairman of the Scientific Council. Liebhaberg is the chairman of Gauche Réformiste Européenne (G R E), a policy think tank that works in Belgium and in other member states in close cooperation with FEPS. He is also the Director General of the Centre on Regulation in Europe (CERRE), a European think tank founded in 2010 at his initiative which brings together some forty universities, regulators and operators active in network industries, such as energy, telecommunications and rail transport. The objective of CERRE (www.cerre.eu) is to contribute through its fully independent research, dissemination and training activities to a more mature, robust, stable and professional regulation in those crucial sectors for the economy and for the citizens. Professor Liebhaberg has also been teaching since 1979 first at the European Studies Institute and then at the Solvay Brussels School of Economics and Management, Université Libre de Bruxelles (ULB).

Author or editor of various articles and books including "Renewing the Left in Europe: Towards a European Reformist Left ", Editions Luc Pire (2008) and " Regulation, Citizenship, Social Contract ", GRE / PAC (2010), Bruno Liebhaberg regularly contributes to European media.

He started his career as a European Commission trade official, involved in GATT (now WTO) negotiations, and, subsequently, a member of the private office of former European Commission President Jacques Delors, whom he advised on policy aspects relating to industrial affairs.

He has an MA in Management Sciences from the Solvay Brussels School of Economics and Management, ULB (1975) and a doctorate (Ph.D) in Industrial Relations from the London School of Economics and Political Science (1982).
